## **Country Music Hall of Fame**

The Museum presents the crown jewels of its vast collection to illustrate country music's story as told through the turns of two centuries. A treasure trove of historic country video clips and recorded music, dynamic exhibits and state-of-the-art design, regular menu of live performances and public programs, Museum Store, on-site dining, and fabulous public spaces all contribute to an unforgettable museum experience.

The Hall of Fame is an easy ½ mile walk from our hotel, or you may use public transportation (MTA Bus 15) which stops at the corner by the hotel and by the museum. It runs through the afternoon at 15 to 20 minute intervals.

## **Grand Ole Opry**

Nothing says 'Nashville' quite like the Grand Ole Opry. During any given Opry show, audiences can expect the best in country, bluegrass, comedy, gospel, and more performed by Country Music Hall of Famers, Opry members who helped establish the Opry as the home of country music, revered superstars, and rising rookies just starting to make names for themselves. "The Grand Ole Opry celebrates the diversity of all the musical styles under the country music umbrella. In addition, the Opry presents the many generations of artists who have formed country music's rich legacy and continues to forge its future course," says Opry General Manager, Pete Fisher. "The key to the Opry's longevity can be attributed to its ability to evolve with the ever-changing musical landscape of the times."

*Due to historic flooding in Nashville in May, the Grand Ole Opry building was closed for renovations. While we expect it to reopen by October, there is no guarantee it will be ready. However, the show WILL GO ON regardless... although it may be in a different venue. Optional bus will be available with a minimum of 25 paid passengers. ## **Keynote Speaker**

Dr. Janann Sherman is the Olin Atkins Professor and Chair of the History Department at the University of Memphis. Sherman received her Ph.D. from Rutgers University in 1993. Her particular areas of expertise are twentieth century America, and women and American politics. She has published five books, including The Perfect 36: Tennessee Delivers Woman Suffrage, No Place for a Woman: A Life of Senator Margaret Chase Smith, Conversations with Betty Friedan, Memphis in Black and White and Beale Street (co-authored with Dr. Beverly Bond). Current projects: a biography of pioneer aviator and 99s charter member Phoebe Fairgrave Omlie, and a History of the University of Memphis.

As a founding member of the group Little Texas, Dwayne went to the top of the charts with three number-one hits. The group also has received Academy of Country Music's 'Vocal Group of the Year' award, Country Music Television's 'Video of the Year' award for "What Might Have Been", and the Country Music Association award. As a songwriter, Dwayne has won numerous ASCAP awards.

Dwayne's musical success allowed him to pursue his passion for aviation, specifically his love of sport flying and aerobatics. The majority of his flight hours have been in his Bellanca Decathlon and his beloved Pitts S-2B. He is a member of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, the Experimental Aircraft Association, the International Aerobatics Club, and the Warbirds of America. With his solo album, Song Pilot, Dwayne's combines his love of flying with his craft of songwriting with songs that capture the beauty and excitement of flight.
