Lorri Hughes Pritchard – Flight Safety

Lorri Hughes Pritchard was born in Columbus, attended Westerville North HS and Ohio University where she received an Associates degree in Aviation. Later she attended Franklin University for a BS in Finance. Lorri started in aviation by flight instructing, teaching ground school and flying checks at night. She then continued on to be the second female pilot at Executive Jet Aviation flying Learns and went on to Eastern Airlines flying the DC9 and L1011 then spent several years with Evergreen Airlines flying 747s and 727s.

As Program Manager at FLightSafety for the Citation Ten, Lorri currently trains mainly NetJet Pilots. She is the mother of two sons. She raises and shows quarter horses and currently has a World Champion. <http://www.flightsafety.com/>

Mott's Military Museum

Originally founded by the Motts' family in their 1870's residence, the museum has grown to a 5,100 square foot facility through the generosity of Columbus Attorney Robert R. Richards, who was a former special agent of the War Department during World War II, and many veterans and their families whose donations included not only cash, but their artifacts, skills and labor. Motts Military Museum is unique because it encompasses all periods of military history with all countries in which the United States has been involved. The museum is committed to telling the stories of the brave military men and women that have served and are still serving this great country allowing us to live in freedom. Of special interests will be a recently opened exhibit that highlights the contributions of the WACS/WASPS in World War II.

Our tour guide will be a member of the founding family, Warren E. Motts. A career photographer, Mr. Motts takes great pride in recounting not only the history behind the exhibits, but how the exhibits came to be in the museum. Mr. Motts has promised us an in-depth narration with behind the scenes tidbits. His enthusiasm and wit are not to be missed. Transportation to and from the museum included.

Banquet Speaker Carol Ann Garratt

Carol Ann Garratt, former manager of a Fortune 500 company, earned her private pilot license in 1978 and her instrument rating in 1980. In 1996, she completed her commercial license and bought a Mooney in 2000. After her mother suffered and died from ALS, Carol Ann flew around the world in 2003 to raise awareness and donations for ALS.

Carol Ann spent 18 months planning for her world record attempt and with co-pilot Carol Foy, set out from Orlando International on December 2nd, 2008 to fly around the world westbound. The first six legs went like clockwork. The seventh leg, across Africa, had its difficulties, but with the help of their ground crew, everything continued almost on schedule. They arrived back in Orlando after 8 days, 12 hours and 20 minutes, just 90 minutes ahead of a massive cold front plowing its way across Florida.

Not just content to fly, Carol Ann built her first plane in 2006. Today she owns and flies three different aircraft. Carol has over 3500 hours and flies more than 400 hours a year including flying students with the EAA Young Eagles program, the sick and needy with Angel Flights, and instructing cadets with the Civil Air Patrol.

Carol is the author of two books which will be available for purchase at her presentation: *Upon Silver Wings: Global Adventure in a Small Plane* and *Upon Silver Wings II: World-Record Adventure*. Proceeds from book sales will support ALS research. <http://www.alsworldflight.com/index.php>
