The Champaign Aviation Museum, at Urbana Airport, has become a center of excellence in the restoration of B-17s. Some WASP history to be seen here, as well. The second stop is at the Mid America Flight Museum, where supervised volunteers are currently also working on a B-17. Our tour will be in two groups, one leaving at 12:30 and arriving back at 4:00, and the second leaving at 2:00 and arriving back at 5:30.



Port Columbus opened in 1929 and hosted the penultimate stop of the first National Women's Air Derby. But it saw a lot of other action that first year and

in the years to follow, including the start and finish of Jerrie Mock's around-the-world solo in a single-engine Cessna. We'll have a virtual tour of the old terminal and absorb some of CMH's history, at the same time expanding our knowledge of Ohio's exceptional aviatrixes.



The main focus of the National Veterans Memorial and Museum is on the personal stories of U.S. veterans. Visitors can walk on a grassy area on the roof to view the Columbus skyline and visit the outdoor memorial grove and reflecting pool. Ninety-Nines' guests can visit the museum during our business meeting. Entrance fee is free for veterans, \$16 for seniors, \$18 for adults.

Our Weekend Speakers



LUNCH SPEAKER: Instructor of American Sign Language at The Ohio State University, **Jenny Hurst** is also a pilot and past president of the Deaf Pilot's Association. Her talk will answer some of these questions: What is it like in a silent cockpit? How do the deaf pilot and ATC communicate? Are all control towers accommodating? How do the regs differ for the deaf pilot? What is some of the developing assistive technology that could expand the flying experience for them?

KEYNOTE BANQUET ADDRESS: Within 2 minutes of departure from KOSU, **Christine Mortine** (DPE, CFI-I, MEI, Tailwheel) experienced an engine failure 1,000' AGL within the greater Columbus, Ohio metropolitan area. Christine's presentation shares her experience from requesting take off from tower to landing in a canopy of trees. She describes the decision-making process and talks candidly about the aftermath of a traumatic event.

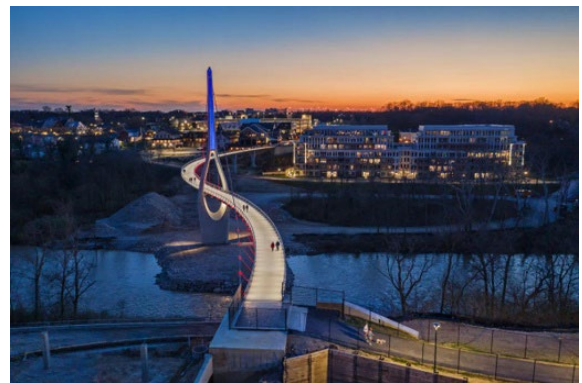
